Dear Lakeside Families,

It looks as if we are emerging from the grips of the COVID 19 pandemic at last. All grade levels in the Lakeside Union School District are currently able to attend classes in-person with the current Hybrid A/B Instructional Schedule. Approximately 55% of our students are now choosing to attend in-person instruction. It has been wonderful to see our students on campus again.

The District Advisory Committee (DAC) has been working all year to ensure we are giving our students the best possible learning opportunities, in conditions that are safe and secure for students and staff. On April 6th our last grade level of students were welcomed on campus for in-person instruction. Since that time, the DAC has monitored the success of our in-person instruction and began exploring options for increasing the amount of time for in-person instruction across all grade levels. After much strategizing, examination, and discussion, the DAC has recommended that we continue to utilize our current Hybrid A/B Instructional Schedule throughout the end of the 2020-2021 school year. Although everyone on the DAC agreed that in-person instruction is what is best for our students, it was decided that further disruption and change to our daily schedules would have more of a negative impact, than benefit for our students and their families.

Therefore, the Hybrid A/B instructional schedules at both Suburu and Lakeside Schools will remain in place and consistent throughout the end of the school year on May 28th. We are still in a pandemic and though things are looking more and more positive with each passing day, we must remain vigilant.

Please look for information coming soon regarding extended learning opportunities for students during the summer months. These opportunities will target students identified for support to mitigate the effects of learning loss during the COVID 19 Crisis.
